Danville Art League Serving All Local Artists

Whether you're an established artist or a beginner interested in exploring your creative side, the Danville Art League offers something for you. The Danville Art League (DAL) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing art experiences for the public through classes, exhibits, and as a resource center.

The organization began in 1938 as an art club with 12 members. University of Illinois professor John Rauschenberger served as the instructor. After World War II classes were reorganized under the sponsorship of the American Association of University Women.

By 1947 the group was revived as the Danville Art League. In 1955 the Art League held its first Art in the Park festival, the forerunner of the current Arts in the Park festival, which now has a separate board. In 2010 the League purchased the Red Cross building at 320 North Franklin in Danville. They are open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9 am – 12 pm and by appointment.

Presently, they are offering after-school classes, classes for “late bloomers” and disabled veterans, and monthly Color Splash painting parties. Painting parties vary in the use of mediums, but are usually done in acrylic, using a subject chosen by the teacher.

There are free monthly Saturday classes for members. “On May 7th we offered a Scarves Workshop where everyone painted a silk scarf to wear or give as a gift,” says Kolleen Asaad, DAL president. “is a very popular class!”

Free Golden workshops, open to the public, were held on Friday, June 3rd, from 6-8 p.m. and Saturday, June 4th from 9 am – 3 pm. Artists used Golden products and enjoyed free samples.

Works by the Kickapoo Karvers were on display in the League's Paul Brumaghim Gallery through April. May and



June gallery shows feature the Sharon Schmidt Regional Open Art Competition, which the public was invited to enter. Competitive cash prizes are given for several categories. The reception and critique for this show occurred Saturday, May 7th. The July and August gallery show will feature a portrait exhibit. John and Bonnie Bodensteiner will have an exhibit of their artwork in September and October. In June, the Danville Art League will present their annual display at Lincoln Park's Arts in the Park.

“The DAL has a wonderful pottery studio”, says Asaad. “We have a Pottery Club, which allows the participants to play with clay or learn to throw on the wheel.” The club meets several times a month, including the 2nd and 4th Saturdays. The fee is \$5 per session for members and \$7 for nonmembers. The DAL has all of the needed supplies, including clay, tools and glazes, which can be purchased as needed for a nominal fee. Jim Sheehan and Sue Moudy are the instructors and can be contacted through the Art League.

Yearly memberships are \$25 for individuals, \$10 for students and \$30 for families. Patron memberships start at \$40. Some classes are available to nonmembers (including Color Splash parties), but members have the added advantage of open studio and some free classes. “Many people join the AL classes or open studio for relaxation and social purposes,” says Asaad. “Our members are always helpful to new artists.”

The AL has many volunteer opportunities, including manning the desk on Wednesday and Saturday mornings, teaching or assisting teachers during classes, setting up for classes and yardwork. They also host an annual rummage sale in May.

DACC Medical Imaging Program Offers High Employability for Graduates

Danville Area Community College (DACC) continues to offer unique programs with strong employability options for Vermilion County and western Indiana students. Among those programs are the college's three programs in medical imaging - Radiologic Technology, Echocardiography, and Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

Radiologic Technology, or Rad Tech as it is commonly known, is a two-year Associate in Applied Science degree. Students learn about patient care, anatomy and positioning patients for x-rays, how x-rays are produced, radiation safety including biological effects, and the safety measures associated with protecting patients.

Echocardiography (ultrasound) is a program focused on scanning the heart, using soundwaves to create heart images. In this one-year advanced certificate program, echocardiographers work closely with cardiologists to accurately ensure effective scanning techniques to diagnose heart conditions.



Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ultrasound) involves scanning of soft tissue anatomy, excluding the heart. This one-year advanced certificate program prepares students to be entry-level sonographers focusing primarily on the abdomen and obstetrics/gynecology.

All three imaging programs are hands-on professions that offer hands-on patient care utilizing the latest technology. The programs prepare students for the workforce anywhere in the United States. Medical imaging jobs are in high demand with excellent pay and benefits. Students must pass national tests to become registered in their area of study and maintain skills with continuing education requirements.

In Illinois, Rad Techs can expect to earn \$48,000 to \$71,000. Sonographers and echocardiographers earn \$55,000 to \$85,000.

The most common places DACC medical imaging graduates find employment are at hospitals and clinics. The program's clinical affiliates often hire graduates. While graduates are employed all over the US, locally, most graduates find employment at Carle, Horizon Health, Ascension St. Vincent, IU of Lafayette, and OSF.

Tammy Howard, DACC's Director of Medical Imaging, says prospective students need to possess excellent communication skills, a love for sciences/anatomy/math, a strong work ethic, confidence with hands-on patient care, and critical thinking skills.

“One of the biggest benefits of a degree in our imaging

programs is that health care continues to be one of the largest and most growing professions, and graduates can go anywhere in the United States to find jobs,” she says. “Rad Techs can specialize in many imaging modalities such as Echocardiography, Sonography, CT, MRI, Mammography, Nuclear Medicine, Radiation Therapy, and Interventional procedures such as Heart Catheterizations. Some of these specialties need additional schooling, and others require on-the-job training. A second benefit to any health care degree is how rewarding it is to care for patients. We see patients at their worst, and healthcare providers learn to work fast and effectively while being compassionate and empathetic.”

The program director is proud of the students' overall success, the partnerships with the clinical sites, and especially of the program's instructors. “They are all dedicated, compassionate, and have a true love of teaching.” Madison Harrison is the new Clinical Coordinator for the Rad Tech Program, Jamie Moreland serves as the lead instructor for Echocardiography, and Rachael Arnholt is the lead instructor for Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

Howard feels fortunate to be a part of DACC and the medical imaging programs. “I have high expectations for my students but no more than I would have for myself,” she says. “DACC is not just a job; it's a passion that we have for our student's best interests at heart and a strong desire to see them achieve their goals. DACC is instrumental for our community and the students we serve. DACC is more than a place to work, it's that feeling of coming home. Faculty and staff work diligently to ensure a more diverse and inclusive environment and are very involved with students and the community. DACC offers many programs (degrees and certificates) that nurture and enhance our students' lives.”

Echo & Sono's application deadline has been extended to August 5th. New classes begin in August.

Students can qualify for the Echo & Sono program with a bachelor's degree in any field of study (not limited to healthcare or sciences) or having an A.A.S degree in an allied health field.

Madeline Stout, LSW, joined Illume Counseling and Wellness Center as its newest therapist. She completed an internship with Illume for her graduate degree and returned as a full-time therapist. "I am very excited to be back!" she says.

Stout's responsibilities as a therapist include supporting clients with whatever they bring into sessions, making sure they feel comfortable and safe, and using a variety of therapeutic techniques to help with their concerns.

Much of her work is focused on children and teens. "I have known since graduate school that I wanted to work with children and teens and have had the opportunity to do so in several different environments," she says. "I love working with children and teens because of their unique challenges and outlook on life. It is an honor to be the trusted person who helps them work through issues they may not feel comfortable discussing with other people and empowers them to create healthy boundaries and relationships for their future."

Stout has many ties to the community. After her internship at Illume, she worked at Survivor Resource Center in Danville before accepting her new position. Her parents are from Danville, where her father owns a local contracting business. She attended St. Paul and Schlarman Academy from preschool to high school. "I have a lot of love for Downtown Danville and all the effort that has been made to help it thrive," she says. "There is a great need for mental health services. I am very happy to be a part of this community and help area individuals!"

Social work drew Stout in because it taught her to look at a client's life and everything going on around the person (family, school, friends, community, etc.) and the individual. "I love that aspect of social work," she says. "Sometimes it is hard to keep in mind everything else that goes on in a person's life, and remembering that an individual has so many other things happening is very important to me. I chose my field because it is a great honor to be a safe person for



individuals and work through obstacles collaboratively with my clients. I hope to learn as much as possible to serve my clients and our community better and grow more as a professional."

Stout says people may be surprised to learn how collaborative her work is. "I believe many people think therapy is one-sided from the therapist's perspective, but that's the furthest from the truth! In my opinion, therapy is about equality, mutual respect, and dignity."



"The thing I love most is seeing a client come in week after week and being able to watch and assist in their healing journey. It is an amazing transformation to be a part of!"

She has essential words of encouragement if a child struggles with mental health issues. "Children and teens can greatly benefit from therapy if they are struggling and are open to it," she says. "Getting input and other perspectives from a trusted adult can really help them work through difficult situations or emotions. Often, they feel more comfortable expressing what they truly feel to someone who is not a parent, and that's okay."

WorkSource Enterprises Delivers Exceptional Programs and Services for Area's Disabled Residents

For 51 years, WorkSource Enterprises has provided outstanding programs and services for people with disabilities.

WorkSource is located at 3713 N. Vermilion Street in Danville. The organization employs 40 people.

"We provide work skills evaluation, in-house/on-site community job placement and programs that enhance and enable opportunities for persons with disabilities to live independently,

work and enjoy life," said Brandy Seabaugh, President of Operations and Todd Seabaugh, President of Program Development. "We have operated for 51 years providing services to individuals and families living with disabilities. The Illinois Department of Human Services licenses us to provide community day service/home-based services for persons with developmental disabilities. We have maintained performance-based contracts with the Illinois Division of Rehabilitation Services for 40 years."

WorkSource services include vocational assessment, employment

preparation, work experience, job coaching, job placement and follow-up services for persons with significant developmental, learning, emotional or physical disabilities.

WorkSource Enterprises was first incorporated as a non-for-profit in 1971 under the name Vermilion County Rehabilitation Center. Since 2005, they have operated as WorkSource.

WorkSource Enterprises completed a \$4,000,000 expansion of its existing building in 2021. The new vocational training expansion would not have been possible without the generosity of Julius W. Hegeler II and his foundation. In 2016, WorkSource built a 12,000-square-foot building for community day service programming. The new expansion adds 38,000 square feet of space for the growth of community day services, job placement for adults with a diagnosed disability,

and work/vocational learning opportunities for individuals served. As with the 2016 building, accessibility and ease of use for consumers were considered during the new expansion. The layout allows for maximum benefits for social, recreational, exercise, community and work opportunities.

WorkSource Model for Programs and Services

Life Skills-Developmental Training

For those who may need alternatives to traditional vocational programs because of advanced age, health, physical limitations, cognitive impairment or other life circumstances, WorkSource offers support in a variety of activities, including gardening, using the library/internet, social activities, cooking, and a broad range of activities of daily living. The specially trained staff works with over 110 consumers both one-on-one and in group settings to help them achieve and maintain their independence.

Recreation and Leisure

The richness of our life is defined by our participation in the social, spiritual and recreational opportunities that are a part of every community. WorkSource encourages and supports involvement in "Community Integration," i.e., organized games, sports, outdoor activities, hobbies, music, volunteer work, basic education, physical fitness, mutual support groups and spiritual or religious activities. Activities for community day training can occur on-site and at various community sites.

Vocational Assessment

To identify consumer vocational skills, aptitude and goals, an intensive formal Vocational Assessment is administered. The assessment incorporates a variety of practical tests, both in-house and off-site.

Vocational Training and Employment

WorkSource provides job training for people with disabilities initially in a working production environment where they can learn valuable work and social skills to prepare them for a job in the community. "Our modern production shop uses real work in a setting that meets each consumer at their functioning level while highlighting and reinforcing each person's 'abilities' rather than any 'disabilities,'" says Brandy.

Case Management/Mentoring

Whether a disability is mild or severe, professionally trained staff provide case coordination focused on working toward the person's preferred lifestyle based on needs, skills, preferences and resources.

Transportation

Without access to transportation, people with disabilities can be isolated from jobs, friends, public services, and other experiences that help make a community "home." Utilizing both specialized (CRIS rural mass transit) and general public transportation, WorkSource Enterprises helps assure that consumers have access to needed services and support.

WorkSource also provides community day/vocational services during the school year to high school students, at least 16 years of age, who are attending Danville High School's Special Education or any Vermilion County Alternative/Special Education Programs. Staff is active on the county-wide Transition Planning Committee advocating for vocational opportunities for students with special needs.

"WorkSource's involvement in the community goes beyond programs," says Brandy. "Staff extends the agency's reach through active involvement in community-wide

committees dealing with student success and via membership in other charitable organizations (VASE Foundation, AMBUCS) that assist children with intellectual and developmental disabilities such as epilepsy, autism and Down syndrome. Staff members are also members of Danville Noon Rotary. We are excited about the new opportunities the expansion has provided to the individuals we serve. The positive community support has been overwhelming."

The organization's Board of Directors includes Rebecca Schlecht (Chairperson), Mary Ellen Baer (Vice-Chairperson), Vince Rancuret (Secretary), David L. George (Treasurer), Rhonda Brown, Lois Wise, Tonya Hill, Kelly Freed, and Dr. Stephen Nacco.

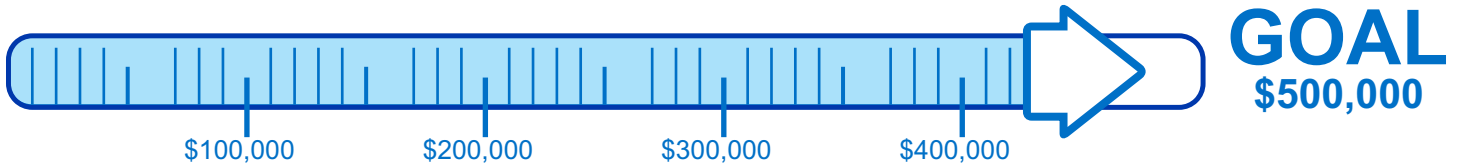

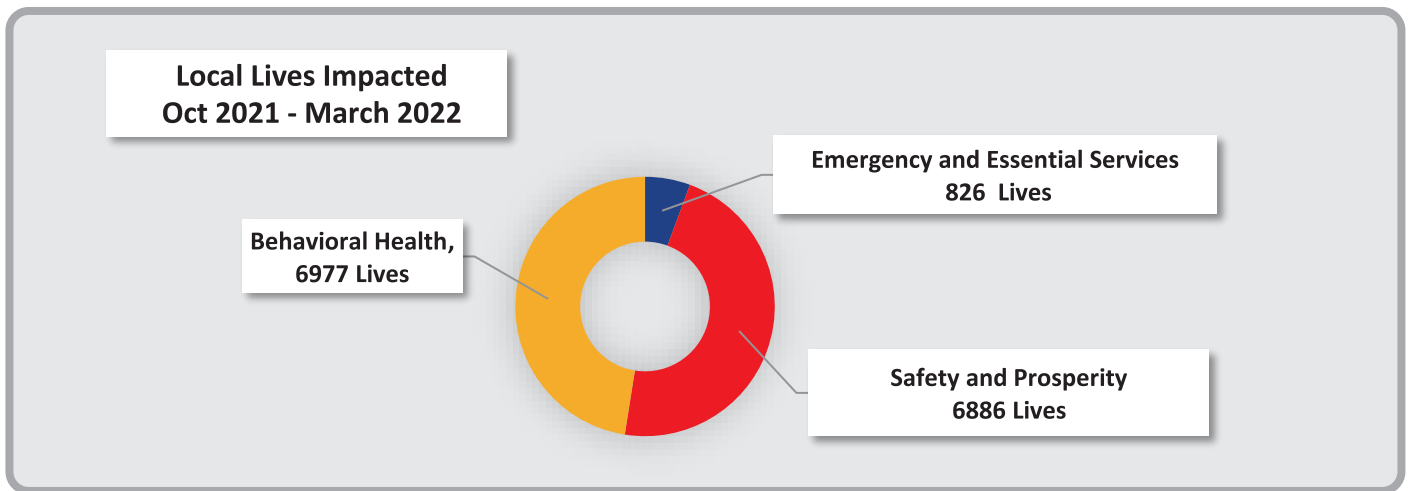
