Welcome Back Family Science Night

After a five-year hiatus, Family Science Night was back at DACC's Mary Miller Gym on Fri., Nov. 3.

Featuring 50 hands-on activities, including the ever-popular "Reptile Road Shows," visiting children and parents enjoyed all of the mysteries and magic of science—from the organic to the molecular to the downright weird.

Biology Distinguished Professor Dr. Wendy Brown led the DACC team, and was pleased to hear the peals of delight from students of all ages. She says, "I thought it was a great success. I have heard from so many community members—including my electrician—about how much they enjoyed this event."

For Dr. Manny Rodriguez, the return of Family Science Night was one of his goals since becoming the Dean of Math, Science, and Healthcare Professions last March. He says, "It was a memorable experience for the community and everyone involved. It was an immersive community experience in science full of amazed faces. It highlighted DACC's faculty, staff, and students' commitment to our community. I feel blessed to be able to be part of this event, and I am looking forward to (next fall's) Family Science Night."

While more than 30 employees helped staff the science exhibits, the event also drew an equal number of volunteers among DACC students. Says Provost Carl Bridges, "DACC can always count on Rad Tech students to volunteer for events as well as those from biology classes and nursing. But so too did PTK students, TRIO, Iconic, All-Star Jaguars, culinary students, presidential scholars, and student-athletes. There were also some students from eSports and the pep band."

The women's softball team managed the concession stand. TRIO's English tutor Britney Henton hosted a booth that featured STEM books and toys. Proceeds from sales would support DACC's Child Development Center.



Claims Examiner Classes Begin

Shortly after Dr. Carl Bridges began at DACC in November of 2021, he met Rhonda Steube, the vice president of Human Resources for Danville-based Cannon Cochran Management Services, Inc.—a.k.a., CCMMSI.

Ms. Steube thought that a partnership with DACC would help recruit and train job seekers for successful careers as insurance claims adjusters. Collaborating with Ms. Steube, Dr. Bridges conceived of this workers'-compensation certificate program.

Two years later, the new program is underway. The first cohort of students in the 30-hour Claims Representative Certificate Program began having classes on October 16.

Kristi Weaver, a senior account manager for CCMMSI, teaches three online classes that specifically focus on the insurance profession: namely, Introduction to Insurance & Risk Management, Workers Compensation 1, and Workers Compensation 2. Students are able take the other required classes—such as business math, medical terminology, customer service, and business communication strategies—from other DACC faculty, either in person or online.

Business & Technology Dean Terri Cummings played a key role in the development of the program. She says, "It's competency-based learning in that students learn best practices from CCMMSI in how to handle an insurance claim, how to conduct investigations, and how to perform legal and claim reviews."

Students graduating from the DACC program with a grade-point-average of 3.0 or higher will have an opportunity to get acclimated as claims adjusters by participating in the LevelUp Career Pathway Program. This is an eight-week paid internship that features on-the-job training and work shadowing.

Graduates of DACC and the apprenticeship will start at \$40,000 a year. After that, they are promoted to claim representative I with an annual salary between \$50,000 to \$60,000.

Financial aid is available through DACC, including Federal Pell and MAP grants and the Federal College Work-Study and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant programs. In addition, students may qualify for support through Vermilion County Works, which covers the cost of tuition and other related expenses you may incur during the program, such as transportation and childcare.
